Course Description

This course is designed for those students who want to further develop sewing skills through more difficult projects. Students will learn to make wise consumer choices as they purchase clothing, fabrics, and accessories. Uses of crafts for leisure-time activities will be explored. There will also be a fun project in which students set up a small business and explore entrepreneurship opportunities in the field of clothing and crafts. Students will be required to furnish or purchase all necessary materials to complete course requirements.
